On being asked about wearing a uniform she said that she enjoys



## INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

### September, 2018

#### Nasavusavu Special Education School.

- Of the fifteen students to be sponsored for the 2019 school year we have eight existing and are still awaiting names for a further seven. These will be decided after the students enrol for next year.
- Quotes for the computer equipment have been received and agreed upon. Purchase and installation will commence soon.
- An additional request for help was received for us to assist with funding for the building of a garage to accommodate the van recently donated by the Fiji Department of Education. The club have agreed to fund this. The Rotary Club of Savusavu have agreed to erect a board to be placed on the garage. Wording to be of our choice: ie. "Project of the Rotary Clubs of Fern Tree Gully, Australia and Savusavu" and featuring the Rotary Wheel. To be ratified at the next Board Meeting.

#### Rotary Club of Savusavu – Global grant project

- Although they are still very keen to have us join them in a global grant project it would seem that nothing is likely to happen in this Rotary year. I am therefore looking elsewhere to spend the \$10,000 set aside for use with a global grant in 2018-19.

#### TeamMed – Nepal

- Nisal Punchihewa, the 4th year medical student from Monash University visited our club to give a presentation on the proposed trip to Nepal by the TeamMED – students. Club members were very impressed and we agreed to give a donation of \$1,000 to this very worthwhile project.

As September draws to a close, our collective efforts in Rotary's Basic Education and Literacy Month, continue to be a source of inspiration and another area where we truly make a difference.

In addition to some existing local and overseas programs championed by our Clubs, two District Grants have recently been approved to support new Club initiatives and programs both here and in Laos.

On the subject of education, the inaugural Australia New Zealand Conference (formerly the Zone Institute) was held in Hobart and was attended by some 600 Rotarians, including 34 from our District alone. Lots of ideas and information was exchanged and many new friendships and contacts were made. More will be shared in due course.

Linking education to youth, our 2018 Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment [RYPEN] has been successfully held, the 2018 Four Way Speaking Contest is in progress, our successful 2019 National Youth Science Forum [NYSF] candidates have had their orientation, our inbound Youth Exchange students are getting about the District, and some new Earlyact, Interact and Rotaract Clubs are in various stages of progress. There's a lot going on and I congratulate everyone involved. Maybe engage with our Program Chairs to discuss potential Club speaker opportunities.

On the Drought Relief front, the efforts and generosity of our Clubs, Rotarians, and friends of Rotary has been truly amazing. There are just so many inspiring stories and we will gather these to share another time. Whilst the Channel 9, National Farmers Federation and Rotary Australia appeal has closed, \$10.2M was raised and \$4.5M has been expended at the time of writing.

I know we have more initiatives in progress, and our District efforts are being focused on District 9650 in NSW, in a point-to-point relationship with people we know there. This challenge will take some time to ease.

Past District Governor Malcolm Chiverton recently shared news that 11 Clubs and two Rotaract Clubs in our District had achieved a 2017-18 RI Presidential Citation.
