While some members had difficulty getting the show on FM radio, it was easily available on Streaming radio. Greg King, our speaker, has been involved for a while in community radio and gave us some growth numbers – Rotary in Action radio has been going since 1994, and it has a tremendous future.

Guest Speaker – Greg King

Greg is a long-standing Rotarian (and is known to us as our DGN's partner), but his involvement with Rotary goes back to 1976 when he was a Technical awardee (the forerunner of the Rotary Ambassador role).

He is the Vocational Chair for District 9810, and is coordinator of the Rotary in Action radio show on 96.5FM.

Greg took us back to the basics, outlining the importance of the Vocational role in Rotary – it is the essence of Rotary. He mentioned the "Shine On" awards, which we have been part of a few years ago with a local woodworker, and spoke at length about "Rotarians doing business with Rotarians", as suppliers or as mentors, and the need to be impartial and remember the 4-Way test at all times. District has an idea to find out the resources we have in our area that we can use to support each other (including retirees).

Our Club has a long history of being involved with Vocation as an area of Rotary Service through Apprentice of the Year awards and DIK. (The "Watch" awards are still available, apparently, even though the original watch supplier shop has changed ownership)

President Ray read out next week's housekeeping duties and closed the meeting at 8.32pm.

Rotary's early emblem was a simple wagon wheel (in motion with dust). It was designed in 1905 by Montague M. Bear, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who was an engraver. He designed the emblem to represent both civilization and movement. Most of the early Rotary clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another. The present emblem, 24 cogs and six spokes, was adopted in 1924. A keyway was added to signify usefulness. An official description of the emblem was adopted at the 1929 International Convention.


