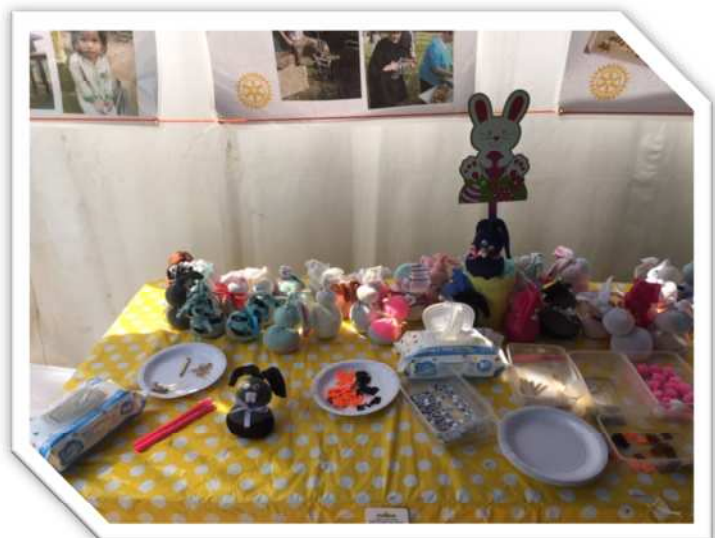

# Knox Festival 2nd & 3rd March 2019



## *"That Was The Week That Was"*

*The meeting opened at 7.04 PM with the toast to Rotary by PP Fran and acting President Christine welcoming members and partners Jill, Kay, and Brian. As this was a club assembly night there was no Guest speaker.*

### **President Christine's report:**

Everything is ready for our club's participation in the Knox Festival over the coming weekend, volunteers required to assist with the putting up the gazebo on Friday evening, and to person/man the stall over Saturday and Sunday from 10 AM to 5 PM each day. Also, to dismantle the gazebo on Sunday at 5:30 PM. Pres Christine attended the district Presidents quarterly meeting together with Graham Aspinall as an Assistant Governor. Highlights of the meeting was a report on Rotoract activity, Rotarian involvement in the environment, and "Domestic Violence" the next steps?

The district changeover will be on 22 June next, the DGN Alma Reynolds is seeking expressions of interest from members in the district to form a committee to plan the district participation in 100 years of Rotary in Australia and New Zealand program to be celebrated in 2021.

Also, in 2023 the Rotary International Conference Will Be Held Here in Melbourne this is a huge event that will bring thousands of Rotarians to Melbourne from around the world there is no doubt that all Rotarians in Victoria will be called upon to assist.

Rotary district membership is at critical levels, it is hovering around 1100 Rotarians in the district, if it falls below this number under Rotary International rules the district will have to merge with another district to maintain district membership requirements.

The club board met on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> February, items discussed:

Thursday, 28<sup>th</sup> February 2019

There were quite a number of issues discussed at the board meeting, acting Pres Christine made it very clear that the board does not dictate to the members how the club operates. The reverse is the case, members are to tell board what they would like to see occur and the board is to implement the members wishes.

There were a number of housekeeping matters that were addressed at the club assembly:

- Nominations required for Club President 2019 (Rotarian Allan Tierney was nominated by PP Paul McAloney and elected unopposed).
- Nominations required for President-elect for 2019 – 2020 (members to consider)
- P. P. Fran's Partner Brian is to act as an interim Treasurer.
- Rotary scholarship application from Timo Este to study nursing.
- A Club Protection Officer to be appointed to conform with "working with children requirements" and develop a register of members who hold the relevant qualification.
- Lengthy discussion around meeting arrangements weekly, fortnightly, types of meetings should they be compressed into one hour, followed by a meal in the restaurant or elsewhere to promote fellowship and to minimise costs of attending Rotary.
- Additional types of membership such as Partner Membership etc.

- The club's continuing involvement with social media needs to be considered, and to determine who is going to take over the role of maintaining the various activities previously performed by former members PP Enid and Pres Ray. Graeme Aspinall has undertaken to maintain the Facebook site. There is a pressing matter in regards to the website page which the club has an invoice for \$72 from district which must be paid by 1st March.
- International Projects: PP Rob Hurst has undertaken to be the contact point for the Fijian projects currently on foot which were previously handled by PP Enid.

# INTERNATIONAL SERVICE MONTHLY REPORT

December, 2018 / January 2019

- **Nasavusavu Special Education School.**

Due to the holiday season there is nothing to report on this project. Continuing sponsorship will need to be confirmed mid year and the funds transferred around October.

- **District/Global Grants**

- **Sungai Kolok project:** David Alexander has returned from Thailand but as yet I haven't heard anything on this project. \$1,500 is earmarked in the Benevolent account for this project.
- **2019 Matadalan Ba Malu Scholarship Applications – Lidia Gomes:** This program has been running since 2005, and each year accepts two women from Timor Lesté into a 10 week intensive language course. I have obtained verbal consent from Club Board members (to be ratified at our February Board Meeting), to commit to \$2,000 which will enable Lidia to complete this course offered by RMIT English Worldwide. RC Melbourne and Family Violence Action Group are also involved. I will advise David Alexander to contact Secretary Graeme Aspinall with the requisite bank details.
- **Harmony Project – Nepal** I was still investigating this possibility as I think it is well worth supporting. If the club are interested in pursuing this the contact is Tony & Robin Stokes. Email: [robyn.stokes@optusnet.com.au](mailto:robyn.stokes@optusnet.com.au). She is a Rotarian and a member of RC Box Hill Central.

There are many grant opportunities available. I would suggest contacting the District International Chair, David Alexander, for assistance in selecting one or more. There is more than \$8,500 available for spending this Rotary year with another \$908.97 due in February - interest from the Term Deposit which is paid into the Benevolent account.

I have enjoyed my time as International Chair and will be sad to sever my relationship with the members of RC Savusavu, Fiji.
