President Christine's report:

Thanked all those who assisted at the club stand at the Knox festival and advised that there were some membership prospects from the effort.

Christine also reported that the girls on Bunnings stand had approached her to see if we could repeat the "bunnies" children's activity at their Easter family night.

Finally, Christine reported that the proposed inter church proposal to help those living rough during the winter had received universal support from the churches and that Steve Barrington had indicated that the required seven churches had come forward to cover each night of the week in providing safe, warm shelter for the homeless.

REPORTS:

Secretary/Treasurer: (PP Graeme Aspinall):

Reported that there had not been any postal mail but that he had received an email from Donations in Kind advising of an open day on 23 March (10am-3pm).

Graeme also reported that he, Paul Wilson and Brian Mandergeddes had met to go over the club banking and funds. Everything had reconciled and they were now to go to the bank to discuss the mechanics of transfer of funds etc.

Youth: (Paul W.): Paul Wilson spoke of the Fairhills Rotaract members helping at the club stand at the Knox Festival and just how good their effort had been. He also advised that there were nineteen starters for the Rotary Junior Community Award project and that the Monbulk club is now taking on that program.

Thursday, 7th March 2019

Fundraising:

Alan Tierney reported that we need more items for another Trash and Treasure sale so it may be that we may have to conduct the proposed sale later if we do not have enough material for the date intended.

Sergeant-At-Arms: (PP Fran) Fran had the meeting in fits of laughter as she told a swag of Irish jokes whilst ripping our dollars off us. I don't know what it is that justifies the poor Irish being so constantly the butt of jokes most of which put them in the dumb category. In our skill contest John Flemming drew the eight of diamonds.

SPEAKER:

Peter Malden has spoken to the club on a number of occasions about the Boronia club's activities in Taveuni. The club has been involved in water and building projects there as well as eye health and it was this subject that he informed us about on this occasion. Peter emphasised the lack of medical care on the outlying Fijian islands and in particular that relating to eye health and cataracts in the young. He supported his talk with a couple of videos which in addition to providing statistical information showed graphic depiction of some of the problems being experienced by patients. One of the major supports of the activity is that it provides a full service in that patients are transported from their homes or villages to Taveuni hospital, treated or operated on and returned to their home. Clearly a fairly costly exercise but in a poor community one that is essential for the success of the project. Each year the project operates for two weeks when it is provided with the hospital facilities and the overall impact of it can be gauged by the fact that last year three 328 procedures were carried out.

Peter indicated that there had been a constant move to involve local people in the project and now 66% of staff were local, many trained as assessors.

The talk concluded with a question time the result of which was I think that our club is now well informed about what is a remarkable and so worthwhile project. Peter indicated that he must raise \$5,000 to receive a matching grant so that the project can continue. Clearly this project is so good that our club must consider supporting.

Mike Spark thanked Peter on behalf of the club and I think echoed the thoughts of our members in expressing the view that we were better informed than before about the project and its worth.
