“The Toilet Warrior” what an inspirational guest speaker is Mark Balla. During a business trip to India Mark was unable to walk away from what he saw.

More often than not when people are confronted by a major issue with global implications you will hear them say “(What can I do ”) I am only one person. Mark decided that such a response would be unacceptable and he made up his mind to get involved. Rather than just sit on the sidelines in 2014 Mark took decisive action. As a result, Mark’s inner humanitarian was wakened and the lives of tens of thousands of underprivileged children have been changed for the better. Mark knew he could make a difference and make a dent in the world by focusing on school sanitation. He established his charity “We Can’t Wait” where together with the Indian government to provide toilets for 110 million people. Mark is a member of the Rotary Club of Box Hill Central, whose project is “Operation Toilets”. Mark through Rotary and the financial support the Rotary Foundation is changing the lives of thousands, where in the world today 2.4 billion people do not have access to a toilet.

I know that our members were very moved by Marks presentation, and it is something we should be discussing as an International project.

Speaker - Mark Balla of Box Hill Central club, on Operation Toilets Australia

Mark joined Rotary with his own project, and the club really got behind him. He had been in India, and was shown a school with 24 kids and 1 teacher with no water and no toilets – the lack of these was responsible for a lack of time at school on the part of the kids and the teacher (the school stops when the teacher has a period!). He was also shown schools in a Mumbai slum where they all dropped out of school – again, no toilets!

He resolved to do something about it, and set up a charity to build toilets in Indian schools. Jack Slim and he are called “Toilet Heroes” and now have dozens of schools with toilets for the first time, but only in a few parts of India.

The Rotary Foundation is a big contributor and allows more and bigger projects to be undertaken – the Indian government is working on the problem also, but.....(for example, 75% of schools don't have enough toilets, and often there is one toilet in a school of 650 kids).

Mark has written a book called “Toilet Warriors”, and he signed and sold the very first copy of the book to us – we will raffle it within the club.

He told us we all need to shout from the rooftops about Rotary and the good that we do - A very good speaker with a great and growing project!

Acting President Christine read out next week's housekeeping duties and closed the meeting at 8-25pm.



Medical Operations Commence October the 7th 2019

Planning is nearing completion and fund raising has commenced but

we need your help

It is proposed to make improvements to the patient screening process as well as volunteers will travel to and screen the more remote parts of the island of Vanua Levu (the first time ever for this region).
