Fellow Rotarians, you are cordially invited to attend the Victorian Aboriginal Remembrance Service at 11am on **Friday 31 May 2019** at the Shrine of Remembrance, St. Kilda Road, Melbourne (Birdwood Avenue Melbourne, Forecourt, Eternal flame, tram stop 19, St. Kilda Road).

This service was started by fellow Rotarian Sam Halim (Rotary Club of Healesville) who, for the first time in Australian military history, honoured the Aboriginal soldiers who fought and made the ultimate sacrifice to Australia.

Buses are available to take you to the venue and return to Sanctuary House Resort Motel in Healesville. You can leave your vehicle in the Sanctuary House car park and go on the bus or alternatively you may drive your vehicle to the service. The service is followed by lunch provided by the Shrine and the Department of Aboriginal Affairs.
