Paul McAloney welcomed our guest speaker Jayne from "GROUP HUG"

Jayne spoke of the work that Group Hug does as a non for profit organisation, that assists families often from a domestic family or trauma situation, and asylum seekers. The work they do is to assist families with basic needs for children from 0-12 years of age, with material aids i.e. Prams highchairs car seats, clothing. This is done by a small group of volunteers (100) they assist approx. 80 families a week, with recommendation coming from child protection welfare agencies and police.

The work they do, hence their name is to offer comfort where words are insufficient. They make up packs of clothing which always includes a teddy bear and books. For the parents they make up packs of toiletries.

Jayne's presentation touched us all we all agreed as a club we will be able to assist.
