KLEVER KAY'S EASY PUMPKIN SOUP

Just 4 basic ingredients, plus seasoning, will give you a really lovely pumpkin soup that takes about 45 minutes cooking/blending time.

APPROXIMATELY 6 – 8 serves

2kg peeled Kent or JAP pumpkin cut into approx. 6cm cubes

3 tbsp mild olive oil

2 litres chicken stock

2 medium brown onions, roughly chopped.

1. **Pre-heat oven to 180 °C.**
2. **In a bowl, put pumpkin and oil, and toss to combine.**
3. **Bake on lined baking trays for approx. 30 minutes until soft. (Maybe longer if cubes larger)**
4. **Meanwhile add onions and stock to a large pot, boil and simmer gently waiting for pumpkin to be cooked.**
5. **Add the hot pumpkin to the pot, stir until boiling and simmer approx.. 10 minutes.**
6. **Blend until you reach desired texture – leave a few chunky bits OR blend the entire contents until silky smooth.**
7. **Season as desired.**
8. **Add grated nutmeg if you wish.**
