

Thursday 26th September 2019

The meeting was opened at 6.30 pm

Announcements:

Christine A: - ACTING PRESIDENT - Welcomed all, including Kay Mc and our guest speaker, Marcia Timmers-Leitch, Knox City Councillor.

Reminded members that our cheque in support of the FTG CFA is to be presented to them at 7.30 pm on 1st October.

Reports

Apologies: President Allan (sick)and Gary Braddock.

GRAEME A: Reminded members that the CBA fund raising BBQ is being held on Friday, 4th October at Kings Park from 6 p.m. The club is to cook beef snags, pork snags and hamburgers.

Graeme cannot help out. Brian, John, Mike and Fran can assist on the evening.

Also reminded us that the next BUNNINGS sizzle is to be held on 11 October 2019. Again, Graeme will not be available.

Youth: Paul Wilson - asked for 17th October to be available for speakers from RYPEN - agreed.

Sergeant-at-arms session Mike S - quoted some already forgotten facts about a forgotten subject.

"SKILL" session. won by PAUL W but with no cigar. Drawn card forgotten. (Sorry)

SPEAKER – MARCIA TIMMERS- LEITCH

Marcia has been a Knox Councillor for around 6 months and has had over 50 residents contact her over issues already.

Marcia's passion is community involvement and assistance, and particularly bringing groups together for mutual support.

- Council has experts to consult on matters of policy. These are not decided by Councillors.
- Council is aiming for greater transparency and accessibility, and is planning to livestream meetings and other council events.

QUESTION TIME:

Several members posed relevant questions about Knox policies and decisions in very lively terms!

Marcia advised that council has approved a "Green streets" policy; the recycling problem has been resolved by the appointment of another recycling contractor; is investigating the uses of combustible food scraps for different purposes; considering whether nature strips can be used to grow herbs etc; no specific discussion has taken place about separate recycling for glass v paper.

The growing high-rise proposals raised specific issues, including concerns about infrastructure. Marcia stated there is not enough funding available in the council budget to pay for all necessary infrastructure.

Comments were made by members and partners about the ugly façade of buildings such as KUBIX, in particular the use of garish colours which did not complement each other and are an eyesore.

Those residents who live in areas that are in green and environmentally important belts can only use muted tonings on the exterior of their homes.

Why was KUBIX and the like allowed to use those ugly colours on their exteriors?

Marcia advised that the quality and design of new buildings must now take into account such things as colour.

John F thanked Marcia for her presentation.




