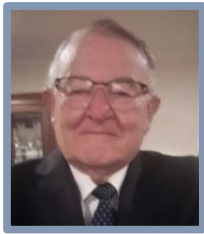

NOVEMBER IS FOUNDATION MONTH

November being Foundation Month I am continuing to provide our members information on the Rotary Foundation.

PolioPlus Fund

The PolioPlus Fund has always been invested only in fixed-income securities [i.e. bonds] because of the need to protect the funds contributed towards the effort to end polio.

In the past when the time horizon for both investment and grant making was longer, the investment portfolio held longer term bonds that generated higher yields.

The PolioPlus Fund portfolio benefited from the long cycle of declining interest rates.

Today the investments are limited to short-term fixed-income securities because the Foundation is raising and disbursing funds within a short time frame as we get closer to reaching our goal.

The returns over the past few years reflect the low interest rate environment and the lower-risk short term nature of the investments.

Rotary International

Rotary International holds a portfolio to ensure that Rotary is financially stable and can cover its obligations in unforeseen circumstances.

These funds are invested in a conservative strategy that emphasizes liquidity and income over capital appreciation.

The Rotary International portfolio is 100 percent invested in fixed income assets.

The Rotary International portfolio earned 2.3 percent in 2019.

Over the past five years the Rotary International portfolio generated an average rate of return of 1.9 percent.

Minutes of F T G Rotary Club Assembly 5th November zoom meeting.

- Discussions had been held with the Ferntree Gully CFA to see if the CFA Hall could be used for a planned Australia Day function which would involve the community. The CFA was happy to allow the club to use their hall for the function, a committee and subcommittee are to be formed to organise the day.
- As part of the arrangements our Federal member Allan Tudge and State member of Parliament Nick Wakeling should be contacted to see if they would be available and the Mayor of Knox and local Councillors be invited to participate.
- As part of the proceedings a “Welcome to Country” ceremony should be held to recognise the local indigenous population.

- As Gary Braddock is unable to talk to the club about CKD on 19 November it was suggested that a fellowship dinner be organised at a local restaurant in place of the Zoom meeting, this was agreed to and details will be provided once organised.

Ingredients:

$\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar

Method:

Cream sugar and egg.

Program Expenditures

(All figures are as of 30 June 2019 and in U.S. dollars.)

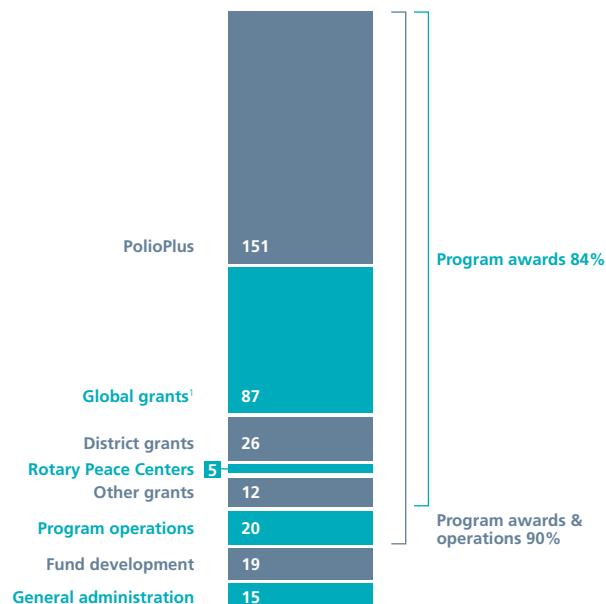
PolioPlus. Since 1988, Rotary and its partners have immunized more than 2.5 billion children against polio. As of June 2019, Rotary had committed \$2 billion to global polio eradication. The goal is to eliminate the virus in the last three countries where it remains endemic and to keep it from returning anywhere else. **In 2018-19, program awards, including PolioPlus Partners grants, totaled \$151.2 million.**

Rotary Peace Centers. Each year, the Foundation supports the training of peace fellows at six Rotary Peace Centers, where they earn master's degrees or professional development certificates. Since 2002-03, 1,284 fellows have graduated from the Peace Centers and are working in more than 116 countries. **In 2018-19, 94 fellows from 43 countries began their studies at the Rotary Peace Centers, and program awards for the fellows and centers totaled \$5.0 million.**

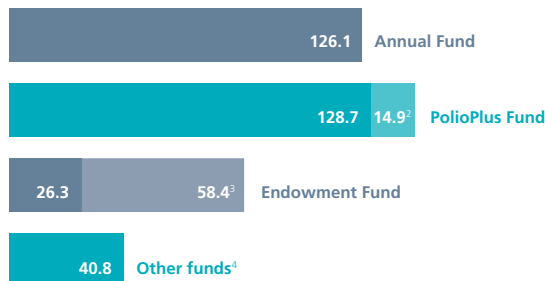
District grants. District grants support small-scale, short-term projects related to the Foundation's mission. **In 2018-19, the Foundation approved 494 district grants, and program awards totaled \$26.3 million.**

Global grants. Global grants fund large-scale international activities with sustainable, measurable results that support Rotary's six areas of focus. Activities include humanitarian projects, scholarships, and vocational training teams. **In 2018-19, the Foundation approved 1,403 global grants, and program awards totaled \$86.6 million.**
