*The meeting opened at 6.32 PM with the toast to Rotary by PP Graeme Aspinall, and for the first time in the new Rotary year in-coming 2019-2020 **President Allan Tierney** welcomed the members in attendance. Our globetrotting members will be returning shortly and should boost attendance numbers henceforth.*

President Allan's announcements:

Allan thanked acting President Christine for guiding the club through a rocky period in the last six months, taking over at short notice following the resignation of President Ray Hollis. President Allan gave a brief summary of some of the changes he wants to make to the club's program and other events and announced Rotary's International Theme for the 2019/2020 Rotary year.



He would like to see the club become more relaxed and semi-formal in the way we view things, but most of all he would like to see fun and fellowship be the dominant goal. He believes if club members enjoy coming to Rotary it will not only maintain and strengthen membership but attract new members.

In order to do this the club program for 2019/2020 is as follows:

- The first Thursday of the month will be a board meeting, the difference being all club members will participate not just chairman of the various committees.
- The second Thursday of the month will be a partner's night
- The third Thursday of the month to be a vocational visit
- The fourth Thursday of the month is an ordinary meeting (keeping in mind our partners are welcome at all meetings)
- For those months that have five Thursdays in the month the 5th will be a fellowship night.

The main focus of the year will be on Membership and Community. Past President Christine will chair these committees but with the involvement of all members to share the load. There will also be a focus on youth but President Allan would like to see that load shared as well.
