**Bad/Good** news! Susan Harris, the Fairhills High teacher who has coordinated the Club's activities, is moving on to other responsibilities, but will be replaced by Karen Dean, an Assistant-Principal and an ex-Rotarian. "The Queen is dead – Long live the Queen!"

**Speaker** - Amanda Croucher-Southwell, a member of the Box Hill Central Rotary Club, on **INTERNATIONAL NEEDS AUSTRALIA.**

Amanda started as a school teacher (for one day!) but luckily for the world ended up teaching at Melbourne University for 5 years.

Her father was heavily into World Vision, so community work was on the cards from the start. She has ended up being a spokesperson for INA, a charity which in many ways echoes the Rotary intentions and directions.

There are over 56,000 registered charities in Australia, 4,567 who operate overseas – BUT only 42 are accredited by DFAT, our Australian Dept. of Foreign Affairs and Trade – and INA is one of those rare organisations who comply with DFAT's high standards!

Focus areas are: Children's rights and education, Women's empowerment, Health and Hygiene, and Sustainable livelihoods. These cover 5 out of 6 of the Rotary International focus areas, so it makes sense to look at supporting them.

They don't give out grants – they give loans to people to progress their own lives and those of their community.

They don't have facilities built by “fly-in” well-doers – but do have visits to show people the results and thus motivate them to go home motivated to do more to assist.

Around the world, more than 62 million people are not educated, and 15 million NEVER enter a classroom. INA focusses on education of women, and thus gaining greater social status and financial impacts within the very poor and oppressed communities in the overseas countries.

World Problems are circular in nature – (1) Hunger, Health and Lack of Facilities/Living Conditions lead to (2) Lack of Education, leading to (3) Lack of Opportunity, leading to (4) Lack of Income, leading to ???= **(GO AROUND THE CYCLE AGAIN!)**.

*I'm impressed by what they do, and how they do it – I believe they deserve our support!*

President Alan closed the meeting at 8-05 pm, after we had dinner in the board room while viewing a video and having questions answered by the very interesting speaker. **Scribe- Mike Spark**
