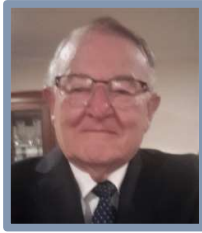

FEBRUARY IS PEACE & CONFLICT PREVENTION/RESOLUTION MONTH

The Multi District Presidents Elect training was held over the weekend of February 13th – 14th. Several hundred Rotarians from three Victorian Districts (9870, 9800, 9810) and the Tasmanian district 9830 were stimulated by two keynote speakers – Annette Kimmitt (CEO of Minter Ellison a law firm) and Michael McQueen (Australian Keynote Speaker of the Year 2015). Both gave inspiring presentations on developing leadership and kick-starting Rotary.

Michael's presentation really stood out. Being a Rotarian from NSW and an author of many books on change. His presentation, "The Post Crisis Kickstart of Rotary" posed many challenges for Rotary Clubs going forward.

Think Tides not Waves - Waves come and go, think of the tide that is slow moving that will change the future.

The Great Remote Experience - How Zoom has allowed us to change what we are able to bring to our meetings and have a Hybrid format.

THE WEEKS THAT WERE

Thursday 4th February, 2021

President Graeme welcomed tonight's Guest Speaker, Kevin Walker speaking on the topic – **A Schizophrenia Journey. "Finding meaning and purpose from psychosis and mental illness"**.

Kevin is a Rotarian; he is the President of the New Generations Rotary Club – a satellite club of Nunawading Rotary. He was dux of his school and achieved an Atar score of 98.7

Life changed for Kevin when he was diagnosed with schizophrenia in 2009 – A non-violent form of psychosis involving delusions and hallucinations. He was in a significant car crash, was hearing voices, had 'out of body' experience, astral projection and delusions.

Not all people with schizophrenia are bad people, which seems to be a misconception of much of the populace.

1990 – wheely bins for rubbish and recycle crates were introduced

Today – 3 bin system

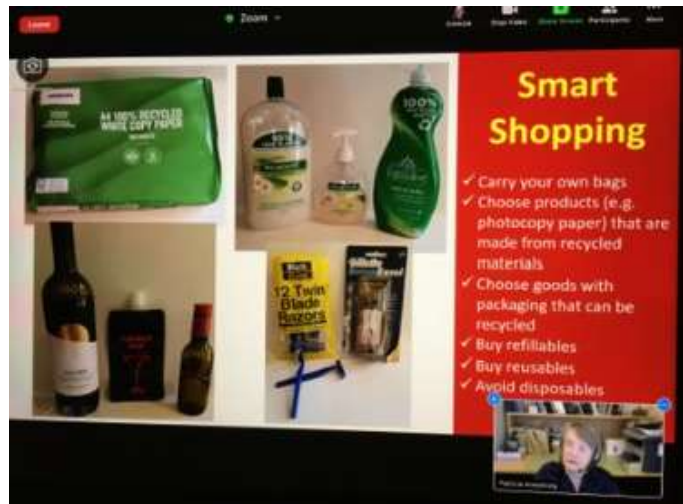
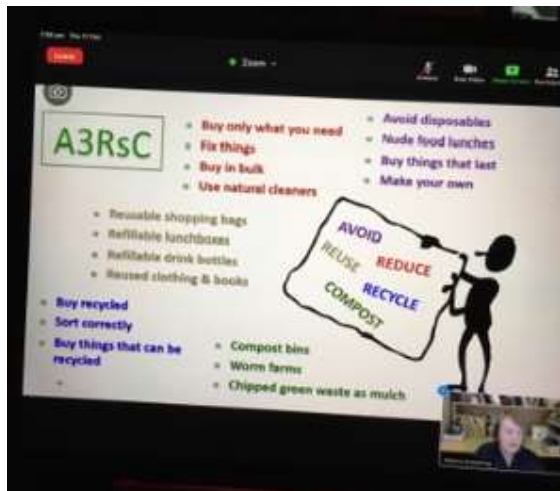
Tomorrow – 3 bin system BUT with:

- FOGO (Food Organics & Garden Organics)
- Container Deposit System (2023) Victoria and Tasmania are the only States without a container deposit system.
- One person makes 3 tonnes of rubbish per year – which is a total weight of 3 Toyota Corollas
- Total waste per person reduced by 3% over 13 years
- Methane gas from landfill is 27 times more potent than carbon dioxide
- 7% of total waste is food waste



Councils pay \$70 per ton landfill levy – if they reduce landfill they can save money !

Lemon Coconut Slice

250 g Butter
 2 cups Castor Sugar
 4 Eggs
 1 ½ cups Plain Flour
 1 Cup Desiccated Coconut
 1 tblspn finely grated lemon rind
 ¼ cup fresh lemon juice
 Icing sugar to dust

Method:

Preheat oven to 180°C. Line 20 x 30 cm slice pan with baking paper.
 Melt butter in saucepan over medium heat. Remove from heat and stir in castor sugar, mix well.
 Add eggs one at a time, mixing well and stir until mixture is thick and glossy.
 Sift the flour over the egg mixture and stir until well combined.
 Stir in coconut, lemon rind and lemon juice.
 Pour into prepared pan.
 Bake 30 – 40 mins until skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean and it bounces slightly to a gentle touch. Set aside to cool completely.
 Place into tray provided and dust with icing sugar to serve.
