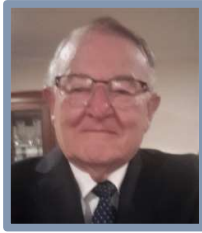

THE WEEK THAT WAS

Thursday 25th February, 2021

President Graeme welcomed tonight's Guest Speaker, Tammy Shepherd speaking on the topic – **"Mercy Ships"**.

These are hospital ships that deliver world-class healthcare to more than 55 developing countries that have limited access modern medical facilities. They were established in 1978.



Tammy Shepherd is a physiotherapist and worked on the ships in 2019, Tammy comes from a medical oriented family her husband being a General Practitioner and her son is also practising in the medical field.

She decided to become involved in community medical work as she felt the need to give back to

society as a means of showing her appreciation for her own upbringing. Her first experience of this type of work was working in a hospital in the Democratic Republic of Congo before becoming involved in the Mercy Ships program.

The Mercy Ships are fully equipped to provide total hospital care on board the ship including complex operations and postnatal care. To date over 2.7 million people in impoverished countries

have been treated, over 1,000 volunteers work on the ships each year.

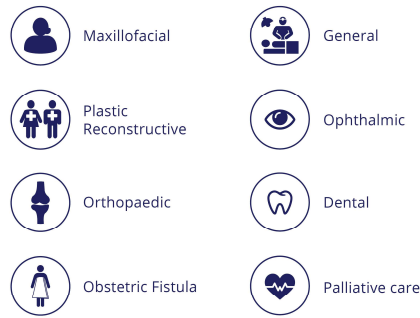
An interesting observation on Tammy's part was that on board the ship there is no hierarchy, all volunteers are treated equal whether they are highly skilled doctors and surgeons, or orderlies. They are all volunteers and have no regard to the race or religion of each other or the patients.



Mercy Ships delivers a customised three-year partnership model with every country it is invited to support.

It's a sobering thought to know that over 18 million people throughout the world will die each year because they do not have access to medical treatment.
