Guest Speaker: Mark Bella - Operation Toilets

Mark revisited the club to give us an update on his toilet project in India. Having visited India several years ago Mark discovered that many girls there don't complete their secondary education due to inadequate toilet facilities. The Rotary Club of Box Hill Central working in partnership with the We Can't Wait Foundation and the Rotary Club of Nasik Road in India, started building toilets in India. Since 2015 this project has expanded to other third world countries. This Rotary year four Rotary Grants totalling \$ 1 million have been achieved through the funding support of other Rotary Clubs.

Mark's latest project is the construction of a 100,000Lt water storage tank in Ethiopia to supply water to a number of schools for sanitation purposes and allow girls to attend school instead of collecting water.

In thanking Mark Paul McAloney (International Chairman) presented Mark with a \$3,000.00 cheque which will go toward their next global grant.
