Guest Speaker – Stephen Flemming –Sport in the Dandenong's from 1840 to 1910

The original name of the Dandenong's was the Corhanwarrabul Ranges and the 1st painting of the area was "The Fern Tree Gully" by Eugene Van Guerard which was presented to Queen Victoria and it remains in Royal Family Collection since 1857.

This was the first Commercial use of Fern Tree Gully, which became a favourite area for regular picnickers. Eventually Dandenong Forest was gazetted as a National Park in 1872.

As a result, hotels were built to take advantage of travellers, the main publicans were George Dickson, Charles Nettleton as well as Frank Lording.

The hotels started their own cricket teams to play other teams in the region eg. William K Ross of the Huntingtower Hotel (the Club) were major sponsors of sports.

Other famous names John T Dobson -Football

Thomas Grimwood -Cricket nicknamed the King of Ferntree Gully

A group photo of 1890 includes 10 members of the Australian test team and the famous W C Grace captain of England played in the 1890 in the Gully.

Overall, Stephen's presentation was very interesting regarding sport, pubs and the effect they had on the growth of Ferntree Gully or should it be Fern Tree Gully?
