

Footy night funds

A COMMUNITY group is gearing up for what it hopes will be a huge fund-raiser to help support a new chaplaincy program in schools.

Ferntree Gully Chaplaincy Group is aiming to raise \$7000 from a sports night at the Ferntree Gully Hotel.

The night will include inspirational talks from former world champion boxer Dave Russell, former Essendon player and now assistant coach Mark Harvey, and former test player Rodney Hogg.

There will be games and a memorabilia auction, including signed football jumpers and footballs, and an Australian Institute of Sport cap signed by Olympic gold medallists including Michael Klim and Matt Welsh.

Proceeds will be used to fund a part-time chaplain who will work with pupils at Ferntree Gully and Ferntree Gully North primary schools one day a week.

Group member Stephen Barrington said community groups and businesses had thrown their support behind the initiative.

Ferntree Gully Primary School principal, Helen Storr said: "It's going to give the families and the children that extra option to make a significant connection with someone."

She said pupils dealing with issues such as parental breakups, and sibling or teacher problems, needed a "listening ear".

"As kids get into these adolescent years, all these issues come up."

The sports night is on Saturday, July 3, from 7, at the Ferntree Gully Hotel, 1130 Burwood High-

way, Ferntree Gully. Cost is \$15 a person. Tables of 12 can be booked.
