



He served as District Governor's Special Representative for the formation of the Warrandyte Club, 1983-4. Club honoured him by naming him a Paul Harris Fellow, 1983 and was awarded District Service Award.

Born in Melbourne, he attended Falconer Street Central School, Collingwood Technical School and RMIT (then Melbourne Technical College). He was apprenticed to the Navy (Williamstown Dockyard) in 1943. Commenced his own building business in 1949, building mostly domestic buildings over the last 30 years mainly in Doncaster-Templestowe area, with commercial building in the Northcote area. Bill has travelled extensively overseas in recent years and finds great satisfaction in making up, especially in the smaller towns, making many friends from this.

Bill is married to Thelma, a member of Box Hill Inner Wheel, and they have four children, Brenda, Allan, Denise and Craig all of whom are married. Thelma and Bill have nine grandchildren.

Report on the District 981 conference held in Albury in February 1986

Before commencing this report, I wish to point out to all members that the behaviour of the Ferntree Gully contingent, who attended the district 981 Albury conference on your behalf, was exemplary.

Any reports you may hear to the contrary are to be regarded as malicious gossip simply or idle rumours, any supporting evidence such as sworn affidavits, photographs or recordings are to be regarded as no value whatsoever.

Having established the ground rules for this report I would like to go on to say that indeed a fantastic time was had by all who attended (Especially the Gully Quintet plus one plus ladies).

The conference opened on Thursday, February 27 with the opening ceremony held at the Albury Civic Centre. Approximately 1217 Rotarians and their wives were registered and would have just about stretched the Albury facilities to the limit. A busy program had been organised for registrants by the host club, the Rotary Club of Box Hill. All of Friday and Saturday morning was given over to the Plenary Sessions with Friday night a club night and Saturday night being a choice of 'Keynote Kapers' or a dance being held at the Civic Centre. The conference ended on Sunday, 2 March with a church service and a barbecue in the Albury botanical Gardens.

Rotary International President ED. Cadman's, personal representative was past victory Governor Bert Dreaver who is a past District Governor of District 292 in New Zealand. Also present, of course was our own District Governor Ted Shaw and Barbara, District Governor nominee at Bill Tierney and District Governor nominee 87/88 Kevin Spier.

The intrepid group from our own ranks consisted of Margaret and myself, Peter and Cheryl Wylie, Brian and Gloria Adams and Ron and Maggie Mitchell together with the 2 irrepressible Johnnies i.e. Johnnies Elliott and Mason.

Highlight of the conference for us, (well one of the highlights anyway) was "Keynote Kapers" held on Saturday night. In which we participated as at the Gully Quintet +1 in a rendition of the "Membership Chairman's lament" all participated; including the ladies who so deftly carried the banner, hopefully there will be some photographs available to have a look at.
