Presidents Christine and Graeme welcomed everyone to the meeting. Welcomed were our guest speakers Angelique Edwards and Glenis from Tamminya House. Parters Jill Wilson, Kay McAloney, Marg Hurst, Soon to be inducted member Graeme Harrison and his wife Sue, and a lovely surprise visit from Trish Carr and Les Marton from Rotary Club for Box Hill Burwood. So a very full house, also our Hybrid Zoomers Gary Braddock and Fran Mandergeddes.

Graeme introduced our guest speakers Angelique and Glenis from Tamminya House. What a very inspiring presentation from them both. I don't believe any of us had heard of this crisis centre before. Tamminya House is a totally volunteer run registered charity that provided emergency/crisis accommodation to single parent families. What was more inspiring was that not only was it established in 2008 it relies from the takings of the Rose St Op shop for its daily running cost. The accommodation provides a safe refuge for up to seven adults and fifteen children. The location is not known to provide security for the clients.

At the present time the only limited cooking arrangements is in the laundry, so by chance at a Bunnings Sizzle, we were introduced to Glenis, and they were invited to tell us about Tamminya House and the next very important project, of building a communal kitchen at the house. The club members agreed to see what assistance we might be able to provide in the way of available grants. Vote of thanks was made by John Flemming.

President Christine explained that the Vocational visits originally planned for the fourth Thursday of the month, are not going to take place due to ongoing covid restrictions, so a dinner booking at the FT Kitchen and Bar, has been planned for 24th February.

President Graeme gave us details of the 1812 Theatre production "Dracula The Bloody Truth" a comedy to be held on Wednesday 23rd Feb.

A reminder of Bunnings Sizzle 11th Feb and the Greek Picnic Sausage sizzle on Sunday 13th Feb Director of Fun and Entertainment Paul McAloney, told us of a Car Rally to be held on Sunday 10th April, and a celebration for St Patrick's Day 17th March to take place more details later. How Tamminya House Began

In 1991 the Urban Land Authority granted Parents Without Partners (Victoria) Inc money to buy land and build the units in outer eastern suburbs. That organisation managed the units until Parents Without Partners (Victoria) Community Services Inc trading as Tamminya House was formed in November 2008. The members of PWP (Vic) Inc then donated the property to Tamminya House in 2014.

Since then the Op Shop in Upper Ferntree Gully and a Board has been manned by a team of volunteers who so generously give their time and expertise to the units.

Over the years many families have passed through our doors and we have given them a helping hand to move onto a better life.

Our sausage sizzle at Bunnings last Friday was slow but steady. Eight members worked over two shifts the afternoon shift pictured below helped to raise \$550.



Our second event was cooking sausages at the annual Greek Picnic at Ferny Creek. Numbers attending were less than expected due to people being cautious attending a large gathering.



- Day 5: Wangaratta – King Valley – Greta Loop
