THE WEEK THAT WAS

Meeting opened at 6.30pm.

Guest Speaker: Les Marton with Trish Marton

Fran introduced our guest speaker Les Marton Topic : History of Audio Recording

In 1877 Edison made his recording of human voice. In 1878 Feb 19th a patent was granted for 2-3 minute cylinders wrapped in tin no foil, no known specimen in existence. A lead cylinder developed by Frank Lambert is the oldest surviving specimen of that era.

In 1881 Charles Tainter / Volta lab made the first lateral cut record without any practical machines to play them back. In 1885 Chishester B / Bell and C Tainter were granted a patent on a machine that they called a gramophone. In 1887 a third type of phonograph was invented by Emille Berliner, the flat 78rpm was born. In 1888 Edison improved the phonograph, he used a battery powered wax cylinder player and E Beliner made a record player for mass production playing a 7" disk with lateral cut groove hand cranked 30rpm.

In 1890 the first Juke Box was invented and earned \$1000 in its first 6 months of operation.

1898 Valdemar Poulsen patented in Denmark the first Magnetic wire Recording machine, he called it the telegraphophone.

In 1900 Thomas Lambert developed a successful method of mass producing celluloid cylinders. Edison later put Lambert out of business by 1907. Edison making flat disks by 1913.

In 1926 Bing Crosby recorded his first record and went on to record 1600 songs over 400 million records, in 1942 White Christmas sold 35 million copies.

In 1925 the electric era replaces the acoustic era, first electrical recorded disc goes on sale.

In 1948 Peter Carl Goldmark working for Columbia invented the record player cartridge mono first then stereo also the then current 33 1/3 vinyl record. In 1962 Phillips invented the cassette player

originally purely designed for Dictaphone. Dr Dolby invented the dolby noise reduction system in 1966.

In 1980 the audio world was turned upside down with the introduction of CD and the video laser disk was also developed. We now have digital recording equipment, we listen to music on our phones and store it on a USB stick.

Martin gave a vote of thanks.

Little time was left of reports.

Christine gave an update on her submission for a grant for Empowering Communities Project. Looked to set a date to get club members to assist in cleaning out a storage container that Alan has. Attended FTGully CFA for a photo Shoot along with the other groups attending the upcoming event.
