Meeting Minutes Thursday July 7th 2022

The meeting opened at 6.30pm and President Fran welcomed those in attendance, particularly Glen and Ron from the Bayswater Rotary Club. Apologies for the meeting were- Rob Hurst, Paul McAloney and Gary Braddock. Fran gave members the welcome news that Gary had received the new kidney that he had been waiting for so long for and that his recovery was going well. Fran commented on the Club's changeover evening and said that she was so pleased with how the night went. She said that the visitors had enjoyed the evening and said that the Mayor in particular was in stitches with Paul Mc's comedy act.

Referring to RDU Fran asked how many members saw opportunities for the Club, perhaps partnering with other clubs for projects. She also emphasised how through the magazine how information could be shared. Fran said that she intended to attend a meeting of the Rotary Club of San Remo and Philip Island simply to see how it operated and see if we could benefit from its operation. She also said that the 21 July meeting would be a show and tell meeting where members could give a short resume of their history.

The matter of a speaker for 21 July and confirmation of the date of the District Governor's attendance was also raised with both matters requiring clarification.

Reports

Community service-Christine said that there is a Traders Association meeting to be conducted on Wednesday next at 5.30 pm and that members were welcome to attend. She also referred to the fact that the Club had been one of the few to receive a Projects award.

Christine spoke of the upcoming Stringybark Festival and indicated that the intention was to make wind chimes from spoons and forks. She asked members to procure them and said that Graham Harrison had offered to drill them so that they could be strung. Christine said that the Community team was meeting with Rosie Massey on Friday 15 July to discuss the Salvation Army outside kitchen.

Fran said that she wanted the Club to engage with the community and that we should ask it what it wanted. To that end she said that we should go ahead with our previously planned cocktail party and query the community.

It was also reported that Knox Historical Society had asked the Club to conduct a sausage sizzle at its proposed craft market and had agreed to the Club having a stall.

Graeme Aspinall referred to the sausage sizzle set for Friday 8 July and indicated that everything was set. He also said that our Past President Sandy Yeats is the new President Elect at the Rotary Club of Lakes Entrance and that he will be the last President of the District prior to its amalgamation.

Youth- Paul Wilson reported on the aborted RYLA program (due to Covid infection) and that he, Christine and Sam were meeting with Fairhills Secondary College to discuss a Rotaract group at the school.

Mike Spark said that he would initiate action for the year's Centurians next week.

Brian Mandergeddes reported that he had received receipts from Rotary International for the Club's payments for Polio Plus and Foundation. He said that he had not completed the accounts at this stage but that they would be ready for Tuesday.

Rosie Massey spoke of the Salvation Army mini market for food relief and that she required volunteers to help on Tuesdays from 9.00am to 11.00am and Wednesdays 9.00am to 12.00 noon

Ron Bridges reported on his Club's (Bayswater) activities but said that given its low membership it sought to get involved with other Clubs in projects. He referred to both the Collier Reserve tree planting and its long standing art show that were proceeding.

Fran outlined a number of areas and bodies where she sought to explore possible Club involvement. They included- Youth in Search, Starlight Foundation, elder abuse, Friends with Dignity and referred to a book, She's Not Your Rehab.

Fran also referred to an Alan Tudge initiative relating to youth suicide and indicated that she would get someone to look into it.

Brian reported that the Club had now received a cash machine allowing it to process card payments.

The meeting closed at 7.20pm.
