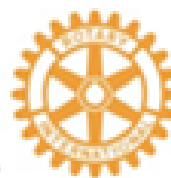

Welcomed Guests – Ian Ballantine {District Governor}, Kay McAloney {Honorary Member}, Kevin Morgan Partners -Jill Wilson, Margaret Hurst and Laurie Massey

Chairman Garry invited DG Ian Ballantine a member of Bentleigh /Moorabbin Rotary Club to address the club

DG Ian gave us a report and outline as to what was happening in regarding the establishment of new District 9815.

Due to the decline of membership the current districts are merging to form a larger district this will also mean that small clubs will be reviewed and merged where practical. Internationally Rotary is growing rapidly in Asia.

DG Ian advised that Hands On projects for better engagement with the community was a priority.

As for Rotary Foundation Ian was impressed with 100% plus for the Centurion Club and donations of \$5000 to Turkey/Syria as well as \$500 to foundation. and that will be his partner Helen's preferred project fund for donations to Polio Plus in Pakistan & Afghanistan.

DG Ian reminded the club the importance of spreading the word of Rotary Membership at all of the events we set up.

Mental Health will be an area of importance internationally and this ties in to our programm, Knox Nocturnals where we are dealing with Youth Issues he was most impressed the project and how the Knox Clubs Cluster is involved.

He was advised of our current donation to Disaster Aid Australia for \$5k for installation of a Sky Hydrant in Timor Leste via Dandenong Rotary

These are the examples of news Ian needs for his Newsletter so it is important we use Club Runner to advise what we are achieving,

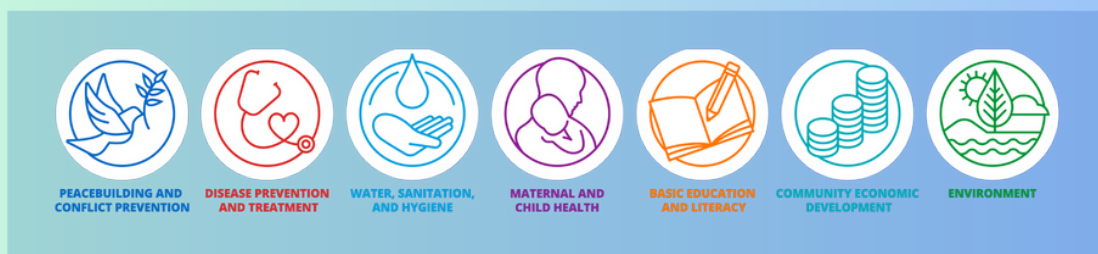

**First** The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service.

**Second** High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.

**Third** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life.

**Fourth** The advancement of the international understanding goodwill, through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

### ROTARY HISTORY

Rotary's two official mottoes

Arthur Frederick Sheldon, the Rotarian whose convention speech inspired Rotary's secondary motto, One Profits Most Who Serves Best

*Service Above Self* and *One Profits Most Who Serves Best*, Rotary's official mottoes, can be traced back to the early days of the organization.

In 1911, the second Rotary convention, in Portland, Oregon, USA, approved He Profits Most Who Serves Best as the Rotary motto.

The wording was adapted from a speech that Rotarian Arthur Frederick Sheldon delivered to the first convention, held in Chicago the previous year. Sheldon declared that "only the science of right conduct toward others pays. Business is the science of human services. He profits most who serves his fellows best."

The Portland gathering also inspired the motto Service Above Self. During an outing on the Columbia River, Ben Collins, president of the Rotary Club of Minneapolis, Minnesota, USA, talked with Seattle Rotarian J.E. Pinkham about the proper way to organize a Rotary club, offering the principle his club had adopted: Service, Not Self. Pinkham invited Rotary founder **Paul Harris**, who also was on the trip, to join their conversation. Harris asked Collins to address the convention, and the phrase Service, Not Self was met with great enthusiasm.

At the 1950 Rotary International Convention in Detroit, Michigan, USA, two slogans were formally approved as the official mottoes of Rotary: *He Profits Most Who Serves Best* and *Service Above Self*. The 1989 **Council on Legislation** established Service Above Self as the principal motto of Rotary because it best conveys the philosophy of unselfish volunteer service. He Profits Most Who Serves Best was modified to They Profit Most Who Serve Best in 2004 and to its current wording, One Profits Most Who Serves Best, in 2010.
