Correspondence

The Finance budget approved by the members was ratified by the Board on Tuesday 11th July 23.

International- Martin

Disaster Aid Project approved by the members was ratified by the board at a cost of \$5000 from the Benevolent Account and will be finalised on receipt of paper work by Martin. This will be a FTG sole project in line with Ivan's o/seas Legacy.

Martin will also follow up on Water Boring Project in Kenya, the \$800 provisionally approved is subject to other clubs currently involved proceeding to complete required funding levels as this would be a joint project only. Martin will also update on following past projects – Cleft Palate. Wheelchair for Kids (check if we can fill containers with knitted blankets.

There being no other business, Gary closed the meeting at 7.35pm

After months of planning and preparation the Knox Nocturnals Youth Program began last Friday at Carrington Park Leisure Centre, Knoxfield.



16 young people attended for the first evening, along with youth leaders and volunteers. A hot meal of pasta and bolognese sauce with garlic bread was provided before the activities started. The participants were broken into three groups and rotated through three 40 minute activities before supper was provided. At the end of the night, buses were available for those who required a ride home.

Whilst the original funding was specific to focus on young people connected to Ferntree Gully, it will now be open to young people from a broader area around Knox as the program needs at least 40 participants. We are sure that over the next couple of session dates the number of young people attending will grow.

1. Is it the **truth**?


2. Is it **fair** to all concerned?

District Conference Launch

The District conference will be held in Warrnambool on March 22nd - 24th 2023. The venue will be the Light House Theatre capacity of 560 for the business sessions and the Saturday Night Gala Dinner a "Marsquerade Ball Theme" will be at the Deakin University. This venue is limited to 350 people. An Early Bird discount of \$50 will be available to the first 100 registrations. The conference full registration fee for Saturday Business Session and The Gale dinner is \$275 with no other discounts applying.

Activities planned for the Friday include Golf, Bowls, a visit to Flagstaff Hill Maritime Village and a Pre-Conference Cocktail Party, limited to 170 people. These events are ticketed events.

Friday Night Club Dinners need to be booked at any of the many restaurants in Warrnambool. To wrap up the conference a self paced 'End Polio Now Walk' (approx 3km) along parts of the scenic Warrnambool Foreshore. This is a ticketed event also with the \$25 registration fee being donated to End Polio.

Clubs will need to book their own accommodation, with many options available but early registration will secure accommodation close to the conference venues. **Registrations will open on Wednesday July 19th, through the District 9810 Web Page.**


