Meeting 24TH August 2023 @ Ferntree Gully Bowling Club

President Gary Braddock opened the meeting at 6.30 pm and then proposed a Toast to Rotary and Australia.

All members present except for apologies

Apologies - M Spark. R Hurst, Fran M. (Zoom not available), Kevin Morgan (Guest)

President Gary introduced guest speaker for the evening Russell Hayes from Wheelchairs for Kids
Russell advised the project commenced in 1996 and now and operates from a factory in Scarborough in WA (Perth Suburb) with the help of 300 volunteers from components imported from China.

The finished product has a steel chassis with wide puncture proof tyres and incorporates special posture seating and an activities tray and costs \$275

Our 1st video showed the children of the countries supplied and how these fit for special wheelchairs help many who have extreme mobility problems and live areas where with poor or no roads. Without the wheelchairs the children to do not get to school or integrate with the community,

Russell showed 2 videos the first showing the difference they made to the recipients of the wheelchairs and how they are now able to get around their community and changes their life.

The second video showed the assembly plant and also how Rotary Clubs fundraise by partnering with schools to buy the wheelchairs including the school children testing the wheelchairs
The wheelchairs are packed in cartons along with a waterproof cushion, soft toy and knitted blanket.

A container of 50 wheelchairs is then sent overseas with the aid of industries and expats of the countries involved in the project

During questions we pointed out we were looking a project to get soft toys and blankets with the aid of local aged care communities in the near future
