Art Garfunkel – of Simon and Garfunkel fame

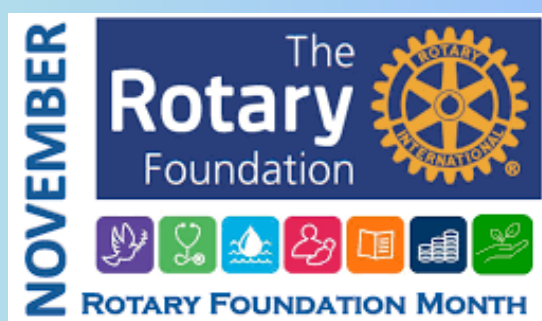

The week That Was

Meeting started 7:30pm.

Opened the meeting welcoming all members and guests and introduced our guest speaker Tom Manson who was going to “educate” us on how to not get scammed on the internet. Tom introduced himself, explaining that he is an IT strategy manager whereby he looks at how to implement IT better. And tonight he will be talking about internet scams, their history, how they work and therefore how to protect yourself.

History

In 1909 “Prince Bil Morrison” published advertisements making a simple request: “would his American acquaintances send him a mere four dollars, and an old pair of pants they no longer needed? In exchange for such a small thing, he would send them vast quantities of ivory, diamonds, and emeralds”..... To him, they were but worthless baubles. Friendship, however, was priceless..... The money and pants poured in. But where were the promised jewels?

This worked because it was Exotic, mystical, involved lots of wealth and it was (presumably) bound by honour and personal values.

The irony was that Prince Bil Morrison was a 14year old American boy.

How they work:

There are three main types of scam:

- Investment Proposals
- Lottery / Competition Win
- Romance / Lonely Hearts

Things to look for:

- A tragic condition
- time bound
- poor English
- family problems
- greed or need
- target older people

Tom went on to summarise the various modern day social media platforms and looking at their scams:

- phishing campaigns – (attachment as a virus)
- phone call scams – (want access to your computer)
- text scams – “click on link” (to install a virus)
- identity theft. (Only need Name, Address, DOB).
- SIM porting – (gain access to your phone)
- crypto donations. (untraceable)

In closing Tom explained that you cannot 100% protect yourself. But you CAN make it very difficult for scammers.

Gary then thanked Tom, went quickly went through housekeeping items and closed the meeting

What is Polio Plus

Ending polio is Rotary's main humanitarian goal, and PolioPlus is the program that supports these efforts.

It was launched in 1985 with help from Dr. Albert Sabin, the developer of the oral polio vaccine, as a worldwide program to protect children from the paralyzing consequences of polio. Rotary later became a founding member of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.

Since then, the incidence of wild polio cases has decreased by 99.9% and the wild poliovirus remains endemic in just two countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan.

The processes Rotary helped build to fight polio have also been used to protect communities from COVID-19 and other diseases. This illustrates the Plus in PolioPlus.

But polio anywhere is a threat to children everywhere. Only global eradication will ensure that no child suffers its devastating effects ever again.
