
Third The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life.


Fourth The advancement of the international understanding goodwill, through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

Kimberly cruising on a Superyacht

Last Thursday we got a glimpse of how the other half live, eleven nights and ten days in the lap of luxury, every desire catered for and pampered in every way whilst experiencing the magnificent Kimberley coastline of Northwestern Australia.

Marg and Kay luxuriated in the lap of luxury on a magnificent superyacht that had more crew than passengers, dining on the finest fare and with an exhaustible supply of top shelf liquor available.

They were able to cruise up coastal rivers in the ship's zodiacs, take helicopter flights over parts of Australia that most of us will never see or experience. Viewed magnificent sunsets and, whilst ashore, explored caves that had aboriginal rock art thousands of years old, and experienced an indigenous smoke cleansing ceremony.

One interesting visit ashore was to a historic site where the wreckage of a World War II Douglas C 53 could still be seen, the pilot became disorientated in the dark and crash landed. Apparently, all the crew survived.

On one of these zodiac trips Kay and one other brave soul took a natural cold-water shower when the zodiac cruised up to, and under a natural waterfall.

When taking these trips all sorts of native and migratory birdlife could be seen, such as Brahminy kites, Egrets, Ospreys and Osprey Nests. Dedicated crocodile spotting trips were available, but the decision was taken that there would be no close-up canoodling with crocodiles.

They did however see sea snakes making babies and "moving mud flats" which turned out to be "Mudskippers" which are an air breathing fish.

When back on board fun and frivolity prevailed. There were professional entertainers on board, comedians and musicians to ensure everyone had a great time. Kay and Marg had made friends with a group of like-minded people and had an absolute ball.

At the end of their presentation, we were able to view a 13-minute video made by the cruise company Scenic, that showed the highlights of the trip, in the video Kay and Marg made a cameo appearance.

At the conclusion of their presentation, PP Fran gave a very eloquent speech as a vote of thanks on behalf of all members present and on Zoom.
