Guest Speaker Ann Grant Shelter Bags

The Rotary Club of Mount Waverley has take on a project to supply Shelter Bags for the homeless

Ann gave a history of the shelter bags, first started by Rotary Terrigul, , Rotary Club M W started a project to supply bags to charities in Melbourn, to distribute the bags to know needy and homeless people . In 2022 100 bags were supplied , 2023 450 bags have been supplied Club is looking for donations from Rotary, Businesses and Banks, to obtain a further 300 bags at a cost of \$30,000.00

The cheapest cost to make is from South Africa, bags are water proof, and contain a mattress and pillow, can be rolled up into a roll pack, with straps to carry over te shoulder

Cost to manufacture 1st lot \$78.00, next order \$86.00, future cost \$90.00 each, which includes making and shipping to Australia

When stock received, they are checked, numbered, rolled up, and supplied no charge to 14 charities for distribution to the homeless
