

Day 2: Congupna–Dookie–Violet Town Loop - 115km
Day 3: Murchison–Rushworth–Toolamba Loop - 104km
Day 4: Waaia–Nathalia–Numurka Loop - 116km
Day 5: Tatura–Kyabram–Mooroopna Loop - 109km
Day 6: Shepparton–Euroa–Avenel–Seymour - 84km
(Distances subject to change due to road/traffic conditions.)

The first four Rotarians

On 23 February 1905, Paul P. Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram E. Shorey gathered in Loehr's office for what would become known as the first Rotary club meeting.

Harris' desire for camaraderie among business associates brought together these four men and eventually led to an international organization of service and fellowship.

Each of the first four Rotarians, and Harry L. Ruggles, who is often called the "fifth Rotarian," brought different professional perspectives to the organization.



President Gary did the Toast to Rotary & Aust

Marilyn then started her presentation for the evening by giving a brief background history of

her involvement in Food share and similar programmes in Knox, Yarra Ranges & Maroondah.

This is the result of 70 % of food wasted is actually edible.

Currently Food share pick up 400 kgs 7 days a week from Costco with whom they have a contract plus other Companies who also donate

This is then supplied to 23 agencies in the above regions e.g. Foot Hills , Salvos who deal directly with the community in need

At present operate with 1 refrigerated van and are currently looking at funding a second van due to travel distances travelled weekly

Their other issue is lack of volunteer drivers as only downtime is at Christmas, NewYear & Easter.

Nothing goes to waste in the chain as what is not seen fit for human consumption is passed down to farms for pig and other animal foods.

A number of questions were asked as to why the reason for waste occurrence.

Poor /Lack of cooking skills

Use by / Best buy dates on products. Marilyn distributed a product date Guidelines which are quite extensive and must be adheared to as well as State Government pamphlet on this subject.

Fran M proposed, the vote of thanks to Marilyn for a most interesting topic.
