Guest Speaker Kevin Morgan topic Philatelic Experiences

His Business is 21st Century Auctions in Ferntree Gully, dealing in stamps

Kevin gave us the history of the business started by his father

Kevin was born and educated in the UK, in his younger days at school, had an interest in stamp collecting and started a stamp club at school, buying and selling stamps , making a 10% profit on stamps sold, he was also a keen trumpet player and part of the school band, his first purchase of stamps was from a dealer, bag of stamps approx. 500 for 5 pound, but bag actually contain 2500 stamps

Also worked at Burger King at Piccadilly as shift manager. Played in bands in Brisbane and Melbourne

Kevin has samples of stamps for sale, some single envelopes with a single stamp were \$300 to \$400 each . had a collection of stamp albums, books with history of stamps and there recommended value for resale'

Also had a collection of five albums of Rotary stamps , from all over the world, in albums donated to then by a collector in Tasmania.

Had a collection of early stamps 1 p local, 2p overseas ½ p make up stamps, value of stamps depends on number available, who owned the stamps does not change the value of the stamp

Mint plates to print stamps valued at \$75,000 to \$80,000, and condition

Post office made more profit out of Philatelic stamp sales than deliveries



### ROTARY'S OFFICIAL MOTTOES

"Service Above Self" and "One Profits Most Who Serves Best" both trace back to the early days of the organization.

In 1911 "He Profits Most Who Serves Best" was approved as the Rotary motto. It was adapted from a speech made by Rotarian Arthur Frederick Sheldon at the first Rotary convention. Sheldon declared that, "Only the science of right conduct toward others pays. Business is the science of human services. He profits most who serves his fellows best."

At the 1950 RI Convention in Detroit, slightly modified versions of the two slogans were formally approved as the official mottoes of Rotary: "He Profits Most Who Serves Best" and "Service Above Self." The 1989 Council on Legislation established "Service Above Self" as the principal motto of Rotary.

Eligible candidates for each of the roles up for election on the Zone 8 Regional Council are now listed on the Creating Tomorrow website. You can view the list of candidates and read summaries of their skills and experience via the following link:

Regional Council roles up for election

There will be a total of six Regional Council roles clubs will be able to vote for in the upcoming election starting on 17 October. These roles are:

- Chair-Elect
- Portfolio Lead: Major Fundraising and Grants
- Portfolio Lead: Membership
- Portfolio Lead: Public Image and Partnerships
- Portfolio Lead: Service Projects and Programs
- Rotaract Nominee (only Rotaract clubs are eligible to vote for this role)

The following Regional Council roles received one eligible application each. The applicants are therefore elected (subject to confirmation at the end of the 15-day objection period from 1 November) and will not be featured on the ballot:

- Chair - Dallas Booth, RC of Turramurra, NSW
- Portfolio Lead: Learning and Development - Euan Miller, RC of Norwood, SA

The Application Review Panel has assessed the applicants for the two roles listed above and deemed they have the necessary skills and experience to complete their duties.

The role of Portfolio Lead: Diversity, Equity and Inclusion did not receive any eligible applications. A suitable candidate for the role will be selected once the Regional Council is in place.

How to ensure your club can vote

Club Presidents will submit one electronic ballot on behalf of their club. Each club's vote will be weighted equally, regardless of their membership numbers.

## Step One

Please ensure your Club President's email address is correct in My Rotary so they can receive the link to vote.

If your Club President is unable to vote during the voting period, email [Zone8Elections@Rotary.org](mailto:Zone8Elections@Rotary.org) before 17 October and specify which Club Officer will be voting instead, providing their correct email address so they can receive the link.

## Step Two

On Tuesday 17 October 2023, Club Presidents will receive an email from our voting platform, Simply Voting, containing a link to vote. Voting will open on the same day at 9am Australian Eastern Daylight Time (AEDT).

Make sure to look in your email's junk folder if you cannot find the email.
