#### **MEETING THURSDAY, 3 APRIL 2025.**

MEETING OPENED AT 6.30 PM. By Co-President Graeme A.

Welcomed those present – all members except Paul Wilson (apology) and Gary Baddock, who was going to attend via Zoom, but, unfortunately, the computer failed to make this possible. Also present was partner Joan Howard.

Graeme introduced our Speaker, Elizabeth McFarlin, the Manager of the Community Transport Department of "Eastern Volunteers, a service which began in 1976.

With their motto "Connecting people to their community," the service provides transport as a one-oneone service taking people virtually "wherever they want to go," within the Melbourne Metropolitan area, with journeys including Melbourne Airport, Warburton and many other "far flung" destinations, virtually wherever they may want to go, either for official or personal reasons.

Single journeys or group trips are possible, e.g. medical, hospital appointments, shopping, outings, social support with friends, and the like.

The service is part of the aged care and disability system, clients have Care Plans in place, with most aged over 65 having had Aged Care Assessments.

All clients are registered and are encouraged to book their trips ahead if possible, and the service operates from approximately 8 am to 5pm, and, can average 150 – 170 trips each day, some as regular trips, others as required.

Most clients live in Eastern Metropolitan Melbourne.

Those with higher care needs may have their Driver remain with them for the duration of their visit, others using the "drop off and pick up" alternative.

There are approximately 80 volunteers assisting the service; all are subject to Police and Volunteer checks and have first aid training, assuring a high level of accountability. Drivers are also aware of individual needs of clients and can render appropriate support as required. Clients are also aware of the level of safety and care given to them by the Volunteers.

Transport includes 13 cars, 4 "mini" buses and one wheelchair converted car.

Following a lively and interesting question time, President Graeme expressed thanks to Elizabeth, with those present expressing their appreciation with applause.

Graeme and Co-President Christine then outlined the Club's commitments to our Community projects over the next week – Saturday afternoon – set up for the "Bikers Swap Meet" on Sunday; Food service handlers for the Sunday event; next Thursday – Bunnings Easter evening, where we will run a children's craft session and hand out free sausages, and our usual Friday sizzle at Bunnings.

So, no physical meeting for 2 weeks!

Meeting closed at 7.30 pm.
